Jesus’ disciples are overwhelmed by the crowd and complain “where can we buy enough food for them to eat?” Jesus makes a young man’s few pieces of bread and a few fish enough to make a difference. The command to feed the hungry is one of the Corporal Works of Mercy. How can we do it every day?



There are direct ways of feeding the hungry. We often take food to family and neighbors when a death or tragedy occurs. How many people work diligently in community food banks or soup kitchens? One of our retired priests tells the story of how as a child he watched his mother make sandwiches for “hoboes” who came to their back door. What a wonderful memory of her “feeding the hungry.”

We can also join causes and groups that combat the causes of hunger around us. It is a never-ending challenge, but one that Jesus’ disciples may not ignore. The ultimate miracle will always be the way in which God moves us personally to share ourselves with those in need, most often one at a time! How do you feed the hungry?
