

Rejection

In Mark's Gospel this weekend, Jesus visits his home town of Nazareth and teaches in the synagogue. His neighbors, however, reject him and wonder who he thinks he is? Coming from such humble roots in their town, they cannot understand that he



could be more than the carpenter's son they knew. Could this be envy or jealousy? Jesus is amazed at their prejudice and is unable to heal only a few sick people because of their closed-mindedness. This shows us how lack of faith can limit what God can do in our lives. Think about how often Jesus is rejected by his own through the gospels.

Rejection is the emotional pain or hurt we feel when we are harassed, unjustly criticized, bullied, betrayed, etc. It is the hurt we experience when feel disrespected for the person we are, for our opinions, our thoughts and our values. Since we all have the need to belong, we will often do just about anything to avoid upsetting or disagreeing with others, just so we can belong to the group. This is how "peer pressure" also works: "If you don't agree with us, we will avoid and punish you -- you may as well be dead to us." It is a form of "group think." If you think differently, you'll be punished! Rejection can really be a horrible thing.

Jesus models for his disciples the sense of perseverance in following the Father's will, even when it upsets people around him. Jesus embodies the virtue of <u>courage</u>. Courage is ability to do hard things when it is time to do so. It is one of the Gifts of the Holy Spirit. This is what we should pray for we are rejected by others. How many saints were martyred for what they believed? Jesus didn't come to please others, but to challenge us to integrity in the way we live and act. He sent us the Holy Spirit, so that through our influence: good may triumph over evil, truth over lies, and peace over violence and division. This is no path for the faint-hearted.
