The Original Sin

This week we return to Sundays in Ordinary Time. Simply speaking, Ordinary time is time that falls outside major holy seasons of the year such as Christmas, Easter and Advent. This does not mean however that Ordinary Time is just the absence of a major season any more than



our lives are ordinary on days that are not holidays. It is the Ordinary time of the calendar that forms the foundation of the liturgical year it comprises almost two-thirds of the calendar.

During the Ordinary time for this year we will be hearing from the gospel of Mark. He tells his story with Jesus at the center encouraging us to follow. As with the other gospels, Mark wants to show how Jesus truly is the son of God with power over sin and death.

Our liturgy starts out by telling the familiar story of how Adam and Eve fell into sin. It is interesting to look at what is taking place in this story and relate the elements to our own lives. When Adam is confronted by God about his transgression he is afraid, ashamed and insecure about his actions. His immediate reaction is to justify the choice he made and blame his wife for his sin, even going so far as to blame God for giving him the woman as his wife. Eve for her part would take no responsibility for her actions rather she blamed the trickery of the serpent. Even though this transgression against God's law brought about shame and divisions among the humans leaving them feel alone, it is the love of God that ultimately reminds them that they are never alone and that His presence is always there. Although they had to suffer consequences for their action they are left with hope, the promise of Jesus.

Evil makes a return in the gospel when the leaders of the church accuse Jesus of working side by side with Satan. Mark shows Jesus working the crowd by asking how evil can work against evil. He then shows how it is the power of the Spirit that has the ultimate power over Satan, and refusal to accept this is the ultimate and unforgivable sin.

We can all relate to each of the characters in our readings today, for we are all guilty of falling into sin and leading others right along with us. Just like with Adam, it is far too easy to point a finger at another and cast blame for our shortcomings and mistakes; it is whole different matter to take responsibility for our actions. When we do fall into sin it does tend to make us feel alienated and alone, and like Adam we forget that the love of God is always there to offer forgiveness and comfort.

St. Anthony

We celebrate St. Anthony Feast Day on June 13. Traditionally, people bread is baked, brought to church to be blessed and shared with others. I will be blessing bread at 8:00 a.m. Mass on Thursday, June 13.

Saint Anthony often has a loaf of bread extending from his outstretched hand. The charity called "Saint Anthony's Bread" was formalized in the 1890s by Louise Bouffier of Toulon, France. Louise managed a small bakery and, one morning, she could not open the shop door with her key. Neither could the locksmith, who advised Louise that he would have to break the door open. While he went to get the tools, Louise prayed to St. Anthony that she would give some of her bread to the poor if the door could be opened without force.

When the locksmith returned, he tried the lock again and was easily able to let Louise in to her shop. True to her word, Louise made sure that the poor of Toulon received their due. Promising the gift of alms to the poor for prayers answered by St. Anthony has been a custom ever since this incident of Louise Bouffier and the locked door.
